Mr. Coyle shared an update on the Port of Missing Men 7.5-acre parcel adjoining Sturges Park. The parcel will be foreclosed for tax purposes and become town property.

5.1 Woodcock Nature Center collaboration

Ms. Linville is working to set up events with Woodcock Nature Center. They have agreed to host 10 walks for the year. Each walk will be \$100 to cover their costs of registration, staff, and event logistics.

Some possibilities for the grant request were discussed including two eagle scout projects, defraying part of the contribution for Open Space acquisition; additional bird housing at McKeon; invasives removal, native tree planting in the apple orchard at McKeon. Mr. Coyle requested written scopes and cost estimates for requests by January 15. Mr. Coyle has drafted the response to the Lewis Grant request.

Mr. Nichols was given an old hand plow that he will put on the shed wall at McKeon.

RCC went through mockups for the McKeon sign and the Rangers hats.

Mr. Nichols asked if he could offer the shed to Whitney for the Winter to store her tractor, the RCC all agreed.
