## **1. APPROVAL OF MINUTES**

## **3) DEER HUNT 2017-18**

Levy Park – The Commission discussed the possibility of a deer hunt in Levy Park. The deed of gift for the land states that the "Park and Recreation Area be known as the B.E. Levy Park and Recreation Area and Wild Life Refuge." The discussion focused on the language, "Wild Life Refuge", and particularly on whether hunting could be permitted on land so restricted.

UPON motion duly made, seconded, and carried by a vote of four to one (two abstentions) it was RESOLVED to recommend to the Board of Selectmen that in view of the restrictive language in the deed of gift, "Wild Life Refuge", no hunting be permitted in the area unless and until clear scientific evidence is presented that one species is causing demonstrated and significant damage to the ecosystem as a whole.

Mr. Levine will invite Pat Sesto to an upcoming meeting for her insight into the original intent of the hunt and the continuation of the hunt. Dr. Kace will contact Highstead about possibly studying one or two open space parcels to determine deer population and browsing patterns.
