




There were 14 new cases reported in Ridgefield on Monday








The New Case Rate in Ridgefield increased to 32.6






Ridgefield continues to have one of the lower New Case Rates in Fairfield County



New Case Rate (Per 100,000 Residents) as of 12/14/2020





This heat map shows the progression of New Case Rates for all towns in Fairfield County






These are the distributions of New Cases and Deaths over age group for the State of Connecticut








The Connecticut New Test Rate higher than all but three other states


Ridgefield has one of the lower Test Positivity Rates in Fairfield County
